Another interesting type of diving that can be done in this area is diving in the springs of the area. These are known as Cenotes.

Cenotes are natural sinkholes or caverns that are filled with fresh water. These are especially interesting on the Yucatan Peninsula. These have open areas which allow divers with Open Water Diver certification to see some amazing sites.

We have put together a trip that gives you the chance to experience both. The trip, which is lead by our instructor Joe Foster, starts in Cozumel and finishes in Playa Del Carmen. Check out all the details and see if want to join us on this diving adventure.

Cozumel Diving

Diving in Cozumel needs no introduction. Whether you have dove Cozumel in the past or not, you have heard of Cozumel. It is all drift diving, very clear waters, big reefs structures, a vast variety of Sealife.

Tiedemann's, has been running trips to Cozumel for over well 30 years. It offers some great diving and everyone should experience it once in their diving career (perhaps even a few dozen times).

The entire coast of Cozumel is a marine national park and is part of the Mesoamerican Barrier Reef, the second largest barrier reef system in the world. In this protected area fishing is not allowed. As you drift along the reefs of Cozumel, be prepared to see a wide range of aquatic life from huge groupers, lobsters, turtles, and sharks.

After three great days of diving and a quick ferry trip, we are now in Playa Del Carmen for the second phase of our trip.



In Playa Del Carmen we will be staying at the Iberostar Tucan. This is another member of the great Iberostar Resort family. An all-inclusive on the beach and close to the amazing Cenotes of the area. Check out the resort with the link below...

Diving the Cenotes is very interesting and unlike anything you may have done in the past. If you ever join us on our annual trip to the Springs of Florida, you have some idea as to what to expect.

The big difference is that the Caverns of Mexico were once dry.

Florida caverns were formed by the water passing thru them. Mexico's caverns were dry caverns that filled with freshwater after the sea levels raised after the last ice age. You have to see them to understand how interesting they are. We will be diving for 3 days, 2 tanks dives, with professionally guided tours. Like on Cozumel we will be using Dresel Divers located on the resort.

If need more diving, there are options for an afternoon boat diving trip.

The Details

As you can see, we have an exciting and unique trip planned.

Trip price includes:

- Transfers from Cozumel airport to hotel.
- Three nights accommodations, at the Iberostar Cozumel Resort.
- · Three days of 2 tank morning boat dives.
- Transfers from hotel to the ferry to Playa Del Carmen.
- Transfers from ferry to Iberostar Tucan hotel.
- Four nights with three days of 2 tank morning dives in the Cenotes
- Transfers from Resort to Cancun airport
- Use of lockers at the Dressel Dive Shop
- Use of tanks and weights for all diving.
- · Nitrox tank fills for certified Nitrox divers.

Options include possible afternoon boat and/or night dive on Cozumel and afternoon boat dives on Playa Del Carman, base on interest.

Price for divers sharing a room is just \$1,995 each.

If you prefer your own room, the price is \$2,500.

Non-divers, family or friends, sharing a room with a diver, can join us on the trip for only \$1,100.

Not included is airfare and tips to dive crew and staff.

Equipment:

Tanks and weights are included in the price of the trip.

You would need to have your own personal gear - mask, snorkel, wetsuit boots, fins and wetsuit gloves. Everything else can be rented.

Each diver needs a full set of Scuba equipment. That includes - BC, regulator with "octopus", SPG, and depth gauge. For thermal protection we recommend a 3 mm wetsuit jumpsuit. If you get cold easily, a 5 mm might be better. We rent 3 mm wetsuit jumpsuits.

The normal price for a one day rental for that on Long Island is \$100. For the trip we have a special price of only \$200 for the entire 6 days of diving.

Optional rental gear available: dive computers, video cameras, and dive lights.

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The following are the details of how the Tiedemann's Diving Center's Advanced Open Water Program works.

"Great divers never stop learning."

What really makes a person advanced at something? Is it just education? Is it just experience? Most people agree it is a combination of both. That combination is what makes the SSI Advanced Open Water Diver certification so prestigious. Unlike that other certification that only requires an open water diver to do five more dives to be certified advanced. The SSI program is built around both education and experience.

To receive Advanced Open Water Diver certification an Open Water Diver has to complete 4 Advanced Specialties and log 24 dives. Since most Advanced Specialties have two dives associated with them, that gives a diver 8 dives. Add that to the 4 dives are required for Open Water Diver certification, the divers has 12 logged dives after they complete their education.

The experience part is just about going diving. As a diver goes on dives, they log their dives. Once a diver has completed a total of 24 dives, they receive the prestigious Advanced Open Water Diver certification.



The great thing about the program is that you can do it in any order. Go on a dive trip and log some dives (like our trip to Mexico). Take a specialty course and get certified in that area.

Once you complete your Open Water Diver certification, you start working on your Advanced Open Water Diver certification by just going on a dive and logging it. A very flexible system...

As you work your way towards Advanced certification, you receive recognition at the midpoint, with Specialty Diver certification. This certification is awarded when you complete 2 specialties and log 12 dives.



Want to go all the way in Recreational Diving? The highest level of recreational certification is Master Diver.

This is reached when a diver completes 50 logged dives, 4 Advanced Specialties and takes a Rescue Diver program. This is a certification that you can truly be proud of.
